Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 296 would amend language relating to the records of patients in institutions under the jurisdiction of the Department of Health and Human Services.

Under current law, a patients records of his or her time spent at the facility may be only accessible to DHHS, a legislative committee, the Governor, or certain other interested public or private agencies by order of a judge or court, in accordance with statutory requirements. Records are also released to the Nebraska State Patrol or victims of crimes in accordance with state law, to law enforcement if a crime occurs on the premises of an institution, upon request when a patient has been dead for fifty years or more, and to current treatment providers.

LB 296 would allow a mental health board to order a release of such records, and would allow records to be released to treatment providers for coordination of care related to transfer or discharge.
