Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 92 amends subsection (9)(a) and (i) of 85-502 adding denominational or parochial standardizing language in statute. In addition subsection (9)(a)(i) and (ii) adds additional clarification language to refer to a diploma of high school equivalency.

In Nebraska we do not have a statute referring to home schools but instead refer to them as exempt schools as per 79-1601 subsections (2) through (6). When a parent files and receives exempt status they are electing not to have their child attend a school that meets state approval and accreditation requirements allowing them to be exempt from mandatory school attendance law in section 79-201.

The addition of language adding students who completes a program of instruction at a high-school in this state that elects not to meet accreditation or approval requirements pursuant to section 79-1601 subsections (2) to (6) would further clarify that an exempt student would be eligible for in-state tuition.

The change in 85-607 would prohibit a publicly funded college or university in Nebraska from discriminating in any manner

against any student who was educated at an exempt school.
