Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB981 amends section 37-1001 originally sought to revive the Trail Development Assistance Act (Act) of 1991, found at sections 37-1001 through 37-1008 to provide resources to address maintenance needs of the Cowboy Trail. LB981 originally sought funding of \$15 million dollars to be disbursed by the Game and Parks Commission at a rate of \$750,000 annually

Sec. 1 Revives the Trail Development Assistance Act sections 37-1001 to 37-1008.

Sec. 2 Substitutes the term "transfer" for "appropriation" in section 37-1003, which established the Trail Development Assistance Fund;

States the Legislature's intent to transfer fifteen million dollars from the General Fund to the Trail Development Fund in FY2022-23, directing the Game and Parks Commission to

use seven hundred fifty thousand dollars annually beginning in FY 2022-23 for ongoing maintenance of designated rail-trails.

Sec. 3 Repeals the original sections 37-1001 and 37-1003.

Explanation of amendments:

AM1983 amends LB981 to conform to the primary purpose of the bill, which is to provide funding for the ongoing maintenance of the Cowboy Trail. The amendment appropriates \$750,000 from the General Fund for the program in fiscal years 2022-23 and 2023-24 and limits permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from funds appropriated to not exceed \$91,140 for each fiscal year.
