- 2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by
- 3 the One Hundred Seventh Legislature, First or Second Session, which
- 4 appropriates funds, FY2021-22 means the period July 1, 2021, through June
- 5 <u>30, 2022; FY2022-23 means the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023;</u>
- 6 FY2023-24 means the period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024; and
- 7 <u>FY2024-25 means the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.</u>
- 8 Sec. 2. <u>APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE</u>.
- 9 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2021-22 and FY2022-23, the sums
- 10 set forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective
- 11 <u>funds for the general operations of state government, postsecondary</u>
- 12 <u>education, capital construction, and state aid, except as otherwise</u>

- 17 otherwise provided. All Cash Fund and Revolving Fund appropriations
- 18 existing on June 30, 2021, in excess of expended and certified
- 19 <u>encumbrance amounts are hereby lapsed unless otherwise expressly</u>
- 20 provided. All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2021, and June
- 21 30, 2022, are hereby reappropriated for FY2021-22 and FY2022-23,
