## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 704**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public health and welfare; to amend sections 38-1414 and 38-1416, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; 2 3 to change education requirements for funeral directing and embalming and apprentice licensure; to eliminate reporting requirements 5 relating to caskets; to repeal the original sections; and to Reissue Revised Statutes 6 outright repeal section 71-609, of 7 Nebraska.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 38-1414, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 38-1414 (1) The department shall issue a single license to practice
- 4 funeral directing and embalming to applicants who meet the requirements
- 5 of this section. An applicant for a license as a funeral director and
- 6 embalmer shall:
- 7 (a) Present satisfactory proof that the applicant has earned the
- 8 equivalent of <u>forty</u> sixty semester hours of college credit in addition to
- 9 a full course of instruction in an accredited school of mortuary science.
- 10 Such hours shall include the equivalent of (i) six semester hours of
- 11 English, (ii) <u>twelve</u> six semester hours of <u>business</u> accounting, (iii)
- 12 <u>four</u> eight semester hours of chemistry, (iv) twelve semester hours of a
- 13 biological science relating to the human body, and (v) six semester hours
- 14 of psychology or counseling; and
- 15 (b) Present proof to the department that he or she has completed the
- 16 following training:
- 17 (i) A full course of instruction in an accredited school of mortuary
- 18 science;
- (ii) A twelve-month apprenticeship under the supervision of a
- 20 licensed funeral director and embalmer practicing in the State of
- 21 Nebraska, which apprenticeship shall consist of arterially embalming
- 22 twenty-five bodies and assisting with twenty-five funerals; and
- 23 (iii) Successful completion of the licensure examination approved by
- 24 the board.
- 25 (2) Any person holding a valid license as an embalmer on January 1,
- 26 1994, may continue to provide services as an embalmer after such date.
- 27 Upon expiration of such valid license, the person may apply for renewal
- 28 thereof, and the department shall renew such license to practice
- 29 embalming.
- 30 (3) Any person holding a valid license as a funeral director on
- 31 January 1, 1994, may continue to provide services as a funeral director

- 1 after such date. Upon expiration of such valid license, the person may
- 2 apply for renewal thereof, and the department shall renew such license to
- 3 practice funeral directing.
- 4 Sec. 2. Section 38-1416, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 5 amended to read:
- 6 38-1416 (1) Before beginning an apprenticeship, an applicant shall
- 7 apply for an apprentice license. The applicant shall show that he or she
- 8 has completed <u>twenty</u> thirty-nine of the <u>forty</u> sixty hours required in
- 9 subdivision (1)(a) of section 38-1414. The applicant may complete the
- 10 twelve-month apprenticeship in either a split apprenticeship or a full
- 11 apprenticeship as provided in this section.
- 12 (2) A split apprenticeship shall be completed in the following
- 13 manner:
- 14 (a) Application for an apprentice license to complete a six-month
- 15 apprenticeship prior to attending an accredited school of mortuary
- 16 science, which license shall be valid for six months from the date of
- 17 issuance and shall not be extended by the board. The apprenticeship shall
- 18 be completed over a continuous six-month period;
- 19 (b) Successful completion of a full course of study in an accredited
- 20 school of mortuary science;
- 21 (c) Successful passage of the national standardized examination; and
- 22 (d) Application for an apprentice license to complete the final six-
- 23 month apprenticeship, which license shall be valid for six months from
- 24 the date of issuance and shall not be extended by the board. The
- 25 apprenticeship shall be completed over a continuous six-month period.
- 26 (3) A full apprenticeship shall be completed in the following
- 27 manner:
- 28 (a) Successful completion of a full course of study in an accredited
- 29 school of mortuary science;
- 30 (b) Successful passage of the national standardized examination; and
- 31 (c) Application for an apprentice license to complete a twelve-month

- 1 apprenticeship. This license shall be valid for twelve months from the
- 2 date of issuance and shall not be extended by the board. The
- 3 apprenticeship shall be completed over a continuous twelve-month period.
- 4 (4) An individual registered as an apprentice on December 1, 2008,
- 5 shall be deemed to be licensed as an apprentice for the term of the
- 6 apprenticeship on such date.
- 7 Sec. 3. Original sections 38-1414 and 38-1416, Reissue Revised
- 8 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
- 9 Sec. 4. The following section is outright repealed: Section 71-609,
- 10 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
