- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to health care; to amend sections 38-201 and 38-203, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 38-2001 and 38-2002, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020; to provide for perinatal mental health screenings under the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Practice Act and the Medicine and Surgery Practice Act; to define terms; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

- 24 Patient Health Questionnaire, or other validated screening methods.

- 26 practice registered nurses, and licensed health care professionals and
- 27 <u>may create a referral network in Nebraska to develop policies,</u>
- 28 procedures, information, and educational materials to meet each of the
- 29 <u>following requirements concerning perinatal mental health disorders:</u>

- 6 <u>accordance with the formal opinions and recommendations of the American</u>
- 7 College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. Screening for perinatal
- 8 mental health disorders may be repeated when, in the professional
- 9 judgment of the advanced practice registered nurse, the patient is at
- 10 <u>increased risk for developing a perinatal mental health disorder;</u>
- 11 (2) An advanced practice registered nurse providing postnatal care
- 12 may invite each postpartum patient to complete a questionnaire and, if
- 13 completed, shall review the questionnaire in accordance with the formal
- 14 <u>opinions and recommendations of the American College of Obstetricians and</u>
- 15 Gynecologists; and
- 16 (3) An advanced practice registered nurse providing pediatric care
- 17 to an infant may invite the infant's mother to complete a questionnaire
- 18 at any well-child checkup occurring during the first year of life at
- 19 which the mother is present and, if completed, shall review the
- 20 <u>questionnaire in accordance with the formal opinions and recommendations</u>
- 21 of the American Academy of Pediatrics, in order to ensure that the health
- 22 and well-being of the infant are not compromised by an undiagnosed
- 23 perinatal mental health disorder in the mother.

- 5 (2) A licensed health care professional providing postnatal care may
- 6 invite each postpartum patient to complete a questionnaire and, if
- 7 completed, shall review the questionnaire in accordance with the formal
- 8 opinions and recommendations of the American College of Obstetricians and
- 9 Gynecologists; and
- 10 (3) A licensed health care professional providing pediatric care to
- 11 <u>an infant may invite the infant's mother to complete a questionnaire at</u>
- 12 any well-child checkup occurring during the first year of life at which
- 13 the mother is present and, if completed, shall review the questionnaire
- 14 in accordance with the formal opinions and recommendations of the
- 15 American Academy of Pediatrics, in order to ensure that the health and
- 16 well-being of the infant are not compromised by an undiagnosed perinatal
- 17 mental health disorder in the mother.
