- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to appropriate federal
- funds to the Department of Health and Human Services; and to declare
- 3 an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) There is hereby appropriated \$50,000,000 from
- 2 Federal Funds for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human
- 3 Services for the purposes described in subsection (2) of this section.
- 4 The Federal Funds appropriated in this section are from the funds
- 5 allocated to the State of Nebraska from the federal Coronavirus State
- 6 Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant to the federal American Rescue Plan Act of
- 7 2021, Public Law 117-2, Subtitle M, Sec. 9901.
- 8 (2)(a) The Department of Health and Human Services shall create a
- 9 program to provide grants to any hospital that employs a front-line
- 10 nurse. Such grants shall be used to provide a premium-pay bonus to such
- 11 <u>front-line nurse.</u>
- 12 (b) A hospital or federally-qualified health center is eligible for
- 13 <u>a grant pursuant to this section if:</u>
- 14 (i) The hospital or federally-qualified health center employs a
- 15 front-line nurse in Nebraska;
- 16 (ii) The hospital or federally-qualified health center identifies in
- 17 the application for the grant the front-line nurse who will receive the
- 18 premium-pay bonus; and
- 19 <u>(iii) Such front-line nurse is not a professional traveling nurse on</u>
- 20 <u>contract.</u>
- 21 (c) A hospital or federally-qualified health center that receives a
- 22 grant under this section shall use the funds to provide a premium-pay
- 23 bonus to the front-line nurse identified in the application for the
- 24 grant.
- 25 (d) Grants awarded pursuant to this section shall be based on the
- 26 number of full-time-equivalent front-line nurses employed by the hospital
- 27 <u>or federally-qualified health center and not be for more than five</u>
- 28 thousand dollars per front-line nurse.
- 29 <u>(e) For purposes of this section:</u>
- 30 (i) Federally-qualified health center as defined in section 42
- 31 U.S.C. 1396d(1)(2)(B), as such act existed on January 1, 2022;

1 (ii) Front-line nurse means a nurse with direct patient-care

- 2 <u>responsibilities; and</u>
- 3 (iii) Hospital has the same meaning as in section 71-419.
- 4 Sec. 2. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 5 passed and approved according to law.
