## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 1252**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to appropriate funds to the
- 2 Department of Economic Development; and to declare an emergency.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) The Legislature hereby finds and declares that:
- 2 (a) The COVID-19 public health emergency has disrupted all areas of
- 3 Nebraska's economy at unprecedented levels;
- 4 (b) Workforce development will be a primary driver for Nebraska's
- 5 economic recovery from the COVID-19 public health emergency;
- 6 (c) The COVID-19 public health emergency has created a workforce
- 7 shortage across the country and in Nebraska;
- 8 (d) It is estimated that there are over fifty thousand available and
- 9 unfilled jobs in the state but less than twenty thousand people seeking
- 10 jobs;
- 11 (e) Employers and potential new employees face a housing shortage,
- 12 which stands in the way of new opportunities;
- 13 (f) The COVID-19 public health emergency has led to inflated cost
- 14 for housing materials for workforce housing units, specifically those
- 15 activities related to demolition and water and sewer infrastructure,
- 16 which impacts the ability of Nebraska's urban communities to recruit and
- 17 retain workforce and hampers the ability of communities to maintain and
- 18 <u>develop viable</u>, <u>stable</u>, <u>and thriving economies</u>;
- 19 (g) The COVID-19 public health emergency and resulting inflation
- 20 <u>have also caused the costs for new housing in urban areas to grow faster</u>
- 21 than Nebraska incomes; and
- 22 (h) In order to develop middle-income housing options that lead to
- 23 the recruitment and retention of a workforce in Nebraska's urban
- 24 communities, new and existing resources to support creation of workforce
- 25 housing funds are needed. Such funds should be used to address the
- 26 <u>negative economic impact of the COVID-19 public health emergency by</u>
- 27 <u>facilitating and encouraging development of affordable middle-income</u>
- 28 housing in Nebraska's underserved urban areas.
- 29 (2) There is hereby appropriated \$20,000,000 from Federal Funds for
- 30 FY2022-23 to the Department of Economic Development for the purposes
- 31 described in subsection (3) of this section. The Federal Funds

- 1 appropriated in this section are from the funds allocated to the State of
- 2 Nebraska from the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant
- 3 to the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law 117-2,
- 4 Subtitle M, Sec. 9901.
- 5 (3)(a) The Department of Economic Development shall use the funds
- 6 appropriated in this section to award grants for development of middle-
- 7 <u>income housing in urban areas authorized by the Middle Income Workforce</u>
- 8 <u>Housing Investment Act.</u>
- 9 <u>(b) The Department of Economic Development may create a program to</u>
- 10 administer the grants awarded pursuant to this section.
- 11 (c) Any program created by the Department of Economic Development
- 12 <u>shall be coordinated and administered in compliance with the federal</u>
- 13 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.
- 14 Sec. 2. (1) The Legislature hereby finds and declares that:
- 15 (a) The COVID-19 public health emergency has disrupted all areas of
- 16 Nebraska's economy at unprecedented levels;
- 17 <u>(b) Workforce development will be a primary driver for Nebraska's</u>
- 18 economic recovery from the COVID-19 public health emergency;
- 19 (c) The COVID-19 public health emergency has created a workforce
- 20 shortage across the country and in Nebraska;
- 21 (d) It is estimated that there are over fifty thousand available and
- 22 unfilled jobs in the state but less than twenty thousand people seeking
- 23 jobs;
- 24 (e) Employers and potential new employees face a housing shortage,
- 25 which stands in the way of new opportunities;
- 26 (f) The COVID-19 public health emergency has led to inflated cost
- 27 for housing materials for workforce housing units, specifically those
- 28 activities related to demolition and water and sewer infrastructure,
- 29 which impacts the ability of Nebraska's urban communities to recruit and
- 30 retain workforce and hampers the ability of communities to maintain and
- 31 develop viable, stable, and thriving economies;

- 1 (g) The COVID-19 public health emergency and resulting inflation
- 2 <u>have also caused the costs for new housing in urban areas to grow faster</u>
- 3 than Nebraska incomes; and
- 4 (h) In order to develop middle-income housing options that lead to
- 5 the recruitment and retention of a workforce in Nebraska's urban
- 6 communities, new and existing resources to support creation of workforce
- 7 housing funds are needed. Such funds should be used to address the
- 8 negative economic impact of the COVID-19 public health emergency by
- 9 facilitating and encouraging development of affordable middle-income
- 10 housing in Nebraska's underserved urban areas.
- 11 (2) There is hereby appropriated \$20,000,000 from the General Fund
- 12 <u>for FY2022-23 to the Department of Economic Development for the purposes</u>
- 13 <u>described in subsection (3) of this section.</u>
- 14 (3)(a) The Department of Economic Development shall use the funds
- 15 appropriated in this section to award grants for development of middle-
- 16 income housing in urban areas authorized by the Middle Income Workforce
- 17 Housing Investment Act.
- 18 <u>(b) The Department of Economic Development may create a program to</u>
- 19 administer the grants awarded pursuant to this section.
- Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 21 passed and approved according to law.
