- 2 points of contact; and to provide duties for the State Department of
- 3 Education, the Division of Behavioral Health of the Department of
- 4 Health and Human Services, and school districts.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB852 2022

1 Section 1. (1) On or before August 1, 2023, each school district

- 2 <u>shall designate one or more behavioral health points of contact for each</u>
- 3 school building or other division as determined by the school district. A
- 4 behavioral health point of contact may be an administrator, a school
- 5 nurse, a school psychologist, or another designated school employee. Each
- 6 behavioral health point of contact shall have knowledge of community
- 7 behavioral health service providers and other resources available for
- 8 students and families.
- 9 (2) On or before August 1, 2023, and on or before each August 1
- 10 thereafter, the State Department of Education, in consultation with the
- 11 Division of Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human
- 12 Services, shall provide each school district with a registry of state and
- 13 <u>local behavioral health resources available to work with students and</u>
- 14 families by geographic area. The registry shall be updated at least
- 15 <u>annually</u> and <u>include</u> resources for both school-based services and
- 16 services accessible by students families outside of school.
- 17 (3) Each behavioral health point of contact shall coordinate access
- 18 to community behavioral health services for students and families and
- 19 facilitate access to services during the school day at the school the
- 20 <u>student attends whenever possible. Except as provided in section 43-2101,</u>
- 21 such facilitation shall be approved by the student's parent or guardian.
- 22 (4) Before the beginning of school year 2023-24, and before the
- 23 beginning of each school year thereafter, each school district shall
- 24 report the designated behavioral health points of contact to the State
- 25 Department of Education.
