- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to incarceration; to amend sections 47-108,
- 2 47-109, 47-116, and 47-206, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
- and section 83-1,135, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020;
- 4 to provide a limitation on the mark-up of commissary goods in county
- 5 and city jails and in the Department of Correctional Services adult
- 6 correctional facilities; and to repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB880 2022

- 1 Section 1. Any goods sold in a commissary within a county jail
- 2 <u>shall not be marked up more than ten percent over the cost to purchase</u>
- 3 such goods.
- 4 Sec. 2. Section 47-108, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 5 amended to read:
- 6 47-108 It shall be the duty of the district court in its charge to
- 7 the grand jury to inform the jury of the provisions of sections 47-101 to
- 8 47-116 and section 1 of this act and all rules, plans, or regulations
- 9 established by the Jail Standards Board relating to county jails and
- 10 prison discipline.
- 11 Sec. 3. Section 47-109, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 47-109 The grand jury of each county in this state may, while in
- 14 attendance, visit the jail, examine its state and condition, and examine
- 15 and inquire into the discipline and treatment of prisoners, their habits,
- 16 diet, and accommodations. If the grand jury visits a jail, it shall be
- 17 its duty to report to the court in writing, whether the rules of the Jail
- 18 Standards Board have been faithfully kept and observed, or whether any of
- 19 the provisions of sections 47-101 to 47-116 and section 1 of this act,
- 20 have been violated, pointing out particularly in what the violation, if
- 21 any, consists. It shall also be the duty of the county board of each
- 22 county of this state to visit the jail of its county once during each of
- 23 its sessions in January, April, July, and October of each year.
- 24 Sec. 4. Section 47-116, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 25 amended to read:
- 26 47-116 If the sheriff or jailer, having charge of any county jail,
- 27 shall neglect or refuse to conform to all or any of the rules and
- 28 regulations established by the Jail Standards Board, or to perform any
- 29 other duty required of him or her by sections 47-101 to 47-116 and
- 30 <u>section 1 of this act</u>, he or she shall, upon conviction thereof for each
- 31 case of such failure or neglect of duty, pay into the county treasury of

- 1 the proper county for the use of such county a fine of not less than five
- 2 dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, to be assessed by the district
- 3 court of the proper district.
- 4 Sec. 5. Any goods sold in a commissary within a city jail shall not
- 5 <u>be marked up more than ten percent over the cost to purchase such goods.</u>
- 6 Sec. 6. Section 47-206, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 7 amended to read:
- 8 47-206 The officer in charge of any municipal prison or jail who
- 9 fails to comply with the provisions of sections 47-201 to 47-205 and
- 10 section 5 of this act or the rules prescribed by the Jail Standards Board
- 11 shall be guilty of a Class V misdemeanor.
- 12 Sec. 7. Section 83-1,135, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 13 2020, is amended to read:
- 14 83-1,135 Sections 83-170 to 83-1,135.05 <u>and section 8 of this act</u>
- shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Treatment and Corrections
- 16 Act.
- 17 Sec. 8. Any goods sold in a commissary within a Department of
- 18 Correctional Services adult correctional facility shall not be marked up
- 19 more than ten percent over the cost to purchase such goods.
- 20 Sec. 9. Original sections 47-108, 47-109, 47-116, and 47-206,
- 21 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 83-1,135, Revised
- 22 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020, are repealed.
