Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB636, introduced by Sen. Albrecht, adds a new section prohibiting political subdivisions in Nebraska from enacting or implementing legislation or policy resolution, rules, or policy that acts to restrict or prohibit the types of fuel or fuel sources

which may be used, delivered, converted, or supplied by a) A natural gas utility; (b) A natural gas transmission company; or (c) A retail marketer or dispenser of propane to serve customers that each is authorized to serve.

The provisions of LB636 do not apply to limit the ability of a municipality that owns its own gas utility from enacting rules, regulations or policies governing their own business practices.
