

LEGISLATIVE BILL 760

Approved by the Governor February 14, 1972

Introduced by Richard D. Marvel, 33rd District

AN ACT to amend section 68-1007, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1969, relating to public assistance; to discontinue certain disregarded income; to repeal the original section, and also section 68-1011, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943; and to declare an emergency.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That section 68-1007, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1969, be amended to read as follows:

68-1007. In determining need for assistance to the aged, blind or disabled, the county board of public welfare and the Director of Public Welfare shall take into consideration all other income and resources of the individual claiming such assistance, as well as any expenses reasonably attributable to the earning of any such income; except that, in making such determination with respect to any individual who is blind, there shall be disregarded the first eighty-five dollars per month of earned income plus one half of earned income in excess of eighty-five dollars per month, and for a period not in excess of twelve months, such additional amounts of other income and resources, in the case of an individual who has an approved plan for achieving self-support, as may be necessary for the fulfillment of such plan, and in making such determination with respect to an individual who has attained age sixty-five, or who is permanently and totally disabled, and is claiming aid to the aged, blind or disabled, of the first eighty dollars per month of earned income the county board of public welfare and the Director of Public Welfare shall disregard not more than the first twenty dollars thereof plus one half of the remainder, and in addition they shall also disregard the first seven dollars and fifty cents per month of any additional income which any recipient might have. ~~With regard to any member of a family receiving aid to dependent children payments, the county board of public welfare and the Director of Public Welfare shall also disregard the first five dollars per month of any income.~~

Sec. 2. That original section 68-1007, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1969, and also section 68-1011, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, are repealed.

Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act shall be in full force and take effect, from and after its passage and approval, according to law.
