Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB703 deals with the Nebraska Optometry Education Assistance Contract Program. Current state law phases out the program with the last eleven (11) students completing the program in FY2014-15. Funding for the eleven (11) students to complete the program is included in the University's current budget.

LB703 would extend the program into the future. The total number of students in the program is not to exceed seven (7) in any academic year and the financial payment is not exceed \$15,000 per student per academic year.

For purposes of the fiscal note it is assumed that the last eleven (11) students are allowed to finish their program and a new class would also begin using a 2-2-2-1 class size, totaling seven (7).

COMMENTS: LB703 changes the optometry student contract program in FY2014-15 to seven students per any academic year at a maximum financial payment of \$15,000 per student for the maximum allowable actual cost of \$105,000 per academic year. Regarding available appropriation, LB195 Sec. 172 (5)(a) (2013) earmarks \$154,708 General Fund for optometry student contracts in FY2014-15. This current appropriation is sufficient to fund the terms of the program as stated in LB703 in FY2014-15. Currently, this earmark would not continue to appear in the FY2015-2017 biennium budget bill as FY2014-15 is the final year for the current group of students. With passage of LB703 into law, I expect the earmark would change to up to \$105,000 for fiscal years beyond FY2014-15 and continue to appear in the biennium budget bill. The University of Nebraska has stated in their fiscal note the expenditures for continuing the current 11 students and also starting the new program in FY2014-15 which exceeds the 7 student limit and the \$105,000 expenditure limit for any academic year.

**LB 334 enacted during the 102nd Legislature-First Session (2011) eliminated funding for the Nebraska Optometry Education Assistance Contract Program. The last cohort of students eligible for the program will complete their studies during the upcoming 2014-15 academic year. It is assumed that LB 703 will not impact the existing 11 students in the program, who are projected to receive approximately \$196,427 of financial assistance in 2014-15. This existing financial commitment is included in the 2014-15 expenditure figures shown above.

LB 703 would allow a maximum of seven students during any academic year to participate in the Optometry program and receive financial assistance of \$15,000 per student. Given most Optometry programs are four years in length, limiting financial assistance to seven students during any academic year would, in effect, limit the number of new students into the program to two a year (and one during every fourth year), as shown in the table below (left). The expenditure figures included above are based on this interpretation of the bill.

The table below (at right) also displays the fiscal impact if the intent of the bill is to allow seven students to enroll each academic year, with a maximum of 28 students (four student cohorts of seven) receiving financial assistance during any academic year.
