Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 29 changes provisions relating to health inspections for children. The bill eliminates a provision allowing the Department of Health and Human Services to prescribe health conditions for which a child must be inspected. It also allows a dentist or optometrist to sign a statement stating a child has undergone an inspection and allows a parent to waive the inspection if a statement is submitted saying the parent objects to the inspection. School districts are required to provide both paper and electronic forms for statements and make electronic forms available on school websites.

The bill does not have a fiscal impact for any state agency. School districts may have a minimal increase in workload to make wavier statements available in written and electronic form.

Explanation of Estimate:

This bill removes conditions from the list of school health inspections prescribed by DHHS, leaving only sight, hearing or dental defects. Adds a parent/guardian written statement as a reason for student not submitting to an inspection in school, and adds dentist and optometrist as professions that may sign a statement that the inspection had been provided and provides a timeframe for when specified health providers conducting such inspections that would result in the school inspection not being required. Requires school districts to provide both paper and electronic forms for statement and make available on the school district's web site in printable format.

There is no Fiscal Impact to the Department of Health and Human Services.

Explanation of Estimate: There would be no additional cost burden to NDE. However the lost revenue to NE schools in federal dollars would be in the millions if the above mentioned health conditions were to go unnoticed and untreated due to absences. According to the National Governors Association, a single absence can cost a school district \$9 to \$20 daily. An average student misses approximately 3 days per year and obese children miss an average of 9 more days than your average student for a total of 12 days. There are approximately 300,000 students in NE public schools, 18% of NE students are obese, therefore we have 54,000 obese students in NE schools. If these students are missing 12 days/year at a cost of \$9/day (utilizing the low cost) that is approximately \$108/student/year. 54,000 students x \$108 averages out to almost \$6 million dollars per year (\$5,832,000/year) loss to school districts! This could be tallied the same way with students missing school due to tooth decay, as well as vision and hearing difficulties.
