Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 636 provides that a Nebraska resident who is deployed out of state with a branch of the military and who is in Nebraska on leave shall be entitled to receive a combination fishing and hunting permit for \$5.00 which will be valid during the leave period. This entitlement is also extended to his or her spouse.

If the military member and/or spouse take advantage of purchasing a permit for the \$5.00 price there will be a revenue loss equal to \$24.00 for each permit issued assuming that they would have purchased the same permit at the full price of \$29.00.

If the military member and/or spouse would **not** have purchased a permit at the regular price of \$29.00, but decide to take advantage of the \$5.00 permit, there will be an increase in revenue equal to \$5.00 per permit plus it will qualify Nebraska for additional federal funds (\$89.96 per permit).

Whether this bill results in a net revenue gain or a net revenue loss to the Game Cash Fund depends on the permit buying decisions of the military member and spouse which are not currently known, therefor the net revenue loss or gain is indeterminate but will likely be minimal.

Since the permit will only be valid for the period of time the military member is on leave, instead of a calendar year, the Game and Parks Commission will need to change their permit issuing system to accommodate this new type of permit. They estimate a one-time cost of \$10,000 cash funds for programming and testing.
