**Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.**

Provisions of LB197 would be applicable to a sanitary improvement district (SID) that is:

- 1) located in a county with a population greater than 5,000 but less than 8,000
- 2) located in a county different from the county of the municipality within whose zoning jurisdiction the SID is located
- 3) unable to incorporate due to its close proximity to a municipality
- 4) unable to be annexed by a municipality with zoning jurisdiction because the SID is not adjacent/contiguous to the municipality

LB197 would grant certain powers (regulate and license dogs/other animals, regulate/provide for streets and sidewalks, regulate parking on public roads and rights-of-way relating to snow removal and access by emergency vehicles, and regulate parking of abandoned vehicles) to an SID that meets the above criteria subject to the approval and restrictions of the municipality within whose jurisdiction the SID is located. Any impact(s) of LB197 would be dependent upon the extent to which an affected SID meeting the criteria specified in the bill would seek to exercise these powers and the extent to which a correspondingly affected municipality would grant related approval.
