The AG states the following reasons for this estimated expenditure impact:

The office handles a significant case load of administrative appeals and enforcement actions. These cases are currently filed in Lancaster County, but under this bill, these cases could be filed in any of the state's 93 counties. This will increase the travel, time, and resources of the AG, and they estimate they will need 3 FTE Assistant Attorney Generals to implement the bill. This estimate also includes any increase in travel expenses.

The Nebraska Supreme Court (Court) estimates no fiscal impact.
